PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68300 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to David G. Thomas of PO Box 115, Rogue River, Oregon 97537, phone 582-3776 or 582-4569, for the use of the waters of Rogue River, a tributary of Pacific Ocean, for the PURPOSE of irrigation of 1.29 acres

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from March 14, 1985

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.016 cfs

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1230 feet South and 910 feet East from the Northwest Corner of Section 21, being within NW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 21, Township 36 South, Range 4 West, WM, in the County of Jackson.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 36 South, Range 4 West, WM Section 21 NW 1/4 NW 1/4 1.17 acres
SW 1/4 NW 1/4 0.12 acre

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before May 13, 1986, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1986. Extended to October 1987

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1987. Extended to October 1, 1988
