PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION **65662** and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to **United States, Malheur National Forest of John Day, Oregon 97845, phone 575-1731**, for the use of the waters of an unnamed stream, a tributary of Antelope Creek (License Plate site), for the PURPOSE of **livestock**

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from **August 26, 1983**

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed **0.005 cubic foot per second**

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: **600 feet North and 2200 feet West from the Southeast Corner of Section 5, being within the SW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 5, Township 17 South, Range 32 East, WM, in the County of Grant.**

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 17 South, Range 32 East, WM Section 5 SW 1/4 SE 1/4 Livestock

Actual construction work shall begin on or before **May 14, 1986**, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 **86**

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 **87**
