PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68294 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife of 506 SW Mill Street, Portland, Oregon 97208, phone 229-5701, for the use of the waters of Ana River, a tributary of Summer Lake, for the PURPOSE of wildlife management (to maintain potholes for wildlife habitat)

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from March 11, 1985

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 1.0 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 60 feet North and 330 feet East from the Northwest Corner of the SW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 6, being within NW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 6, Township 30 South, Range 17 East, WM, in the County of Lake.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

- Township 30 South, Range 17 East, WM Section 7 NW 1/4 SW 1/4 Wildlife management
- SW 1/4 SW 1/4 Wildlife management
- Section 18 NW 1/4 NW 1/4 Wildlife management

Actual construction work shall begin on or before May 28, 1986, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 87

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 88
