PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68480 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Douglas Fanning of Route 1, Box 38, Amity, Oregon 97101, phone 835-3400, for the use of the waters of an unnamed reservoir, a tributary of South Yamhill River, to be constructed under Application R-68479, Permit R-10513, for the PURPOSE of irrigation of 13.0 acres

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from

August 13, 1985

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed stored water only

8.8 acre-feet of

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 540 feet North and 550 feet East from the Northwest Corner of Section 1, Township 6 South, Range 5 West, WM, being within the SE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 36, Township 5 South, Range 5 West, WM, in the County of Yamnill.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 5 South, Range 5 West, WM Section 36 SE 1/4 SW 1/4 1.1 acres Township 6 South, Range 5 West, WM Section 1 NW 1/4 NW 1/4 3.7 acres NE 1/4 NW 1/4 3.2 acres

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 2.5 acre-feet per acre per year for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year from storage from reservoir to be constructed under Permit R-10513.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before September 25, 1986 shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 87

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19
