PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68361 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Gibson and Gibson, partnership and Gibson Land and Livestock Company, Inc. of 668 Greenwood Street, Junction City, Oregon 97448, phone 998-2388, for the use of the waters of Flat Creek (Jaeger Lake), a tributary of * for the PURPOSE of irrigation of 157.0 acres

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from May 28, 1985

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 1.96 cubic feet per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1570 feet South and 30 feet West from the Northeast Corner of Section 12, being within the SE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 12, Township 15 South, Range 5 West, WM, in the County of Benton.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

* Willamette River.

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before October 21, 1986, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1987.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 88.
