## PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68391 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

Arthur W. and Goldie M. Button of 1730 Green Acres Road, Coos Bay, Oregon 97420, phone 267-6476, for the use of the waters of Ferry Creek, a

tributary of Isthmus Slough, the PURPOSE of domestic use for three families including the irrigation of not to for the PURPOSE of exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden for each

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from June 13, 1985

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.02 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 150 feet South and 420 feet East from the North 1/4 Corner of Section 1, being within the NW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 1, Township 27 South, Range 13 West, WM, in the County of Coos.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 27 South, Range 13 West, WM Section 1 NE 1/4 NW 1/4 Domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre

lawn and noncommercial

garden

SE 1/4 NW 1/4 Domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to

exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial

garden

W 1/2 Lot 2 Domestic use for one

family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial

garden

Actual construction work shall begin on or before October 21, 1986, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 87 Extended to October 1, 1988

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19
