PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68488 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to City of Mitchell of PO Box 97, Mitchell, Oregon 97750, phone 462-3522, for the use of the waters of two springs, tributaries of Bridge Creek,

for the PURPOSE of municipal use

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from

August 19, 1985

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 70 gpm, being 40 gallons per minute from Spring 1 and 30 gpm from Spring 2

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: Spring 1-200 feet South and 450 feet West from the Northeast Corner of Section 34, being within the NE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 34; Spring 2-5100 feet North and 3800 feet East from the Southwest Corner of Section 26, being within the NW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 26, both within Township 12 South, Range 21 East, WM, in the County of Wheeler.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 11 South, Range 21 East, WM Section 36 ALL Municipal Township 12 South, Range 21 East, WM Section 1 N 1/2 N 1/2 Municipal

Actual construction work shall begin on or before October 21, 1986, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19
