## PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68408 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to A.E. Staley Manufacturing Company of 2200 East Eldorado Street, Decatur, Illinois 62521, phone (217)423-4411, for the use of the waters of the Stanfield Drain, a tributary of Umatilla River, for the PURPOSE of irrigation of 2.7 acres

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from June 24, 1985 for 0.03 cubic foot per second and August 5, 1985 for 0.038 cfs

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.068 cfs

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1770 feet North and 1230 feet West from the Southeast Corner of Section 31, being within the NE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 31, Township 4 North, Range 29 East, WM, in the County of Umatilla.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 4 North, Range 29 East, WM Section 31 NE 1/4 SE 1/4 2.7 acres

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/40 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before November 15, 1986, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 87

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 88
