PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

"CERTIFICATE NO. 57203

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68596 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

Douglas County School District 4 (Fir Grove) of 1419 Valley View Drive, Roseburg, Oregon 97470, phone 672-7781, for the use of the waters of the South Umpqua River, a tributary of the Umpqua River, for the PURPOSE of irrigation of 0.3 acre

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from

October 23, 1985

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed

0.01 cfs

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1170 feet North and 700 feet East from the Southwest Corner of Section 13, being within the SW 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 13, Township 27 South, Range 6 West, WM, in the County of Douglas.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 27 South, Range 6 West, WM Section 13 SW 1/4 SW 1/4 0.3 acre

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall be further limited during the period July 15 through Spetember 30 of each year to the irrigation of a non-commercial garden not to exceed 0.3 acre in area.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before November 27, 1986and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19
