PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION **65465** and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to U.S. Malheur National Forest of John Day, Oregon 97845, phone 575-1731, for the use of the waters of unnamed tributaries of Fawn Creek at the Aspen Spring and Deadwood Spring sites, for the PURPOSE of livestock, being 0.015 cubic foot per second from each source, provided the total quantity diverted from all sources shall not exceed 0.015 cfs

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from May 20, 1985

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.015 cfs

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: Aspen Spring - 300 feet South and 2200 feet West from the Northeast Corner of Section 33, being within the NW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 33; Deadwood Spring - 2600 feet South and 300 feet East from the Northwest Corner of Section 27, being within SW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 27, both in Township 19 South, Range 31 East, WM, in the County of Harney.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 19 South, Range 31 East, WM	Section 27 SW 1/4 NW 1/4 Livestock
	Section 33 NW 1/4 NE 1/4 Livestock

Actual construction work shall begin on or before **November 27, 1986** and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 **87**.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 **88**
