PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68591 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Stephen B. and Nancy J. Dudley of 17574 Powers Creek Loop, Silverton, Oregon 97381, phone 873-2490, for the use of the waters of an unnamed spring when available with any deficiency in the available supply from the spring * for the PURPOSE of domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from

October 16, 1985

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed

0.01 cfs

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: Spring - 1915 feet North and 280 feet West; Creek Division - 1345 feet North and 2 feet West both from the Southeast Corner of Section 9, both being within the NE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 9, Township 7 South, Range 1 East, WM, in the County of Marion.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

* to be made up by appropriation from an unnamed creek, a tributary of Powers Creek,

Township 7 South, Range 1 East, WM Section 9 NE 1/4 SE 1/4 Domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

Actual construction work shall begin on or before December 16, 1986and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 87

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 88
