PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68562 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Lake Oswego Corporation, an Oregon Corporation, 700 SW McVey, Lake Oswego, Oregon 97034, phone 636-1422, for the use of the waters of the Tualatin River, for the PURPOSE of maintenance of Lake Oswego Reservoir constructed under Application R-68561, Permit R-10591

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from September 24, 1985

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 3.36 cubic feet per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 2585 feet South and 442 feet East from the Northwest Corner of Section 20, being within the SW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 20, Township 2 South, Range 1 East, WM, in the County of Clackamas.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Provided further water shall not be appropriated during the period from July 31 through September 15 of each year.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before March 7, 1987, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 87.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 88.
