PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68600 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Tillamook County of 201 Laurel Avenue, Tillamook, Oregon 97141, phone 842-5511, for the use of the waters of an unnamed stream,

for the PURPOSE of maintenance of Cape Meares Reservoir to be constructed under Application R-68599, Permit R-10602 for recreation

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from October 24, 1985

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 1.0 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 700 feet North and 850 feet East from the Meander Corner of Sections 7 and 8, being within the NW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 8, Township 1 South, Range 10 West, WM, in the County of Tillamook.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 1 South, Range 10 West, WM Section 8 NW 1/4 NW 1/4 Recreation uses Section 7 N 1/2NE 1/4 including boating, SE 1/4 NW 1/4 fishing, waterfowl N 1/2 SW 1/4 hunting and bird-NE 1/4 watching Section 6 S 1/2 SE 1/4 SW 1/4 Section 5 SW 1/4

Actual construction work shall begin on or before March 21, 1987 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 87.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 $\,$ 88 .
