PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68630 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to WTD Industries, Inc. of PO Box 6316, Portland, Oregon, 97228, phone 246-3440, for the use of the waters of North Fork Umpqua River, a tributary of Umpqua River, for the PURPOSE of industrial uses to include moisture control for log cold decks and maintenance of fire protection system for sawmill, planer, kiln, boiler and cyclone buildings and cold decks that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from December 11, 1985

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 1.0 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 80 feet North and 100 feet West from the Southeast Corner of the SW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 17, being within the SW 1/4 NW 1/4 Section 17, Township 26 South, Range 3 West, WM, in the County of Douglas.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 26 South, Range 3 West, WM Section 17 NE 1/4 SW 1/4	7.4 acres cold deck, sawmill and planer
NW 1/4 SW 1/4	3.8 acres cold deck, kiln, boiler room and cyclone
SW 1/4 SW 1/4	0.2 acre cold deck

Actual construction work shall begin on or before May 9, 1987, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 88 .

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 89 .
