PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68585 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Robert G. Morris and Joyce E. Morris of HC 86, Box 196, Myrtle Point, Oregon, 97458, phone 572-3032, for the use of the waters of Hillside Spring,

for the PURPOSE of domestic for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one—half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from October 4, 1985

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 435 feet North and 66 feet East from the Center quarter corner of Section 4, being within the SW 1/4 NE 1/4 Section 4, Township 29 South, Range 12 West, WM, in the County of Coos.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 29 South, Range 12 West, WM Section 4 SW 1/4 NE 1/4 Domestic including

Domestic including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

Actual construction work shall begin on or before May 28, 1987 , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 88 .

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 89 .
