This permit is issued to John E. Pritchard and Berlva L. Pritchard of PO Box 176, Days Creek, Oregon, 97429, for the use of the waters of South Umpqua River, a tributary of Umpqua River,

for the PURPOSE of domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden, being further limited to the irrigation of only the noncommercial garden during the period July 15 through * that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from December 27, 1985

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 755 feet North and 255 feet West from the Southeast corner of Section 9, being within the SE 1/4 SE 1/4 Section 9, Township 30 South, Range 4 West, WM, in the County of Douglas.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 30 South, Range 4 West, WM Section 9 SE 1/4 SE 1/4 0.5 irrigation of 1/2 acre lawn or noncommercial garden Section 10 SW 1/4 SW 1/4 Domestic use for one family

Actual construction work shall begin on or before May 28, 1987, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1988.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 89 .
