PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68487 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Robert H. Stoltz of Route 1, Box 430-NB, Bandon, Oregon, 97411, phone 347-3440, for the use of the waters of Johnson Creek, a tributary of Pacific Ocean,

for the PURPOSE of flood harvesting of cranberries, temperature control and irrigation of 7.54 acres, being 0.38 cubic foot per second for flood harvesting, 1.13 cfs for temperature control and 0.19 cfs for irrigation

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from August 19, 1985

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 1.13 cubic feet per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 136 feet North and 1130 feet West from the Northeast corner of Section 8, being within the SE 1/4 SE 1/4 Section 5, Township 29 South, Range 14 West, WM, in the County of Coos.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 29 South, Range 14 West, WM Section 8 NE 1/4 NE 1/4 7.54 acres irrigation temperature control and flood harvest

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to $\frac{1}{40}$ of one cubic foot per second of its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, for cranberries. If for the irrigation of any other crop, this appropriation shall be limited to $\frac{1}{80}$ of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The permittee shall record and submit annually to the Water Resources Department all pertinent data pertaining to use of water for temperature control on forms furnished.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before June 30, 1987, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1988.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1989.
