PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68482 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Gerald Dean Bliven of Route 2, Box 16, Days Creek Road, Days Creek, Oregon, 97429, phone 825-3511, for the use of the waters of Days Creek, a tributary of South Umpqua River,

for the PURPOSE of domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden, irrigation use and shall be further limited to irrigation of a noncommercial garden during the period July 15 through * that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from August 14, 1985

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 750 feet North and 380 feet West from the Southeast corner of Lot 8, being within Lot 8 (SE 1/4 SE 1/4) of Section 1, Township 30 South, Range 4 West, WM, in the County of Douglas.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

* September 30 of each year

Township 30 South, Range 4 West, WM Section 1 Lot 8 (SE 1/4 SE 1/4) Domestic including the cluding the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and non-commercial garden

Actual construction work shall begin on or before 301y 3, 1986, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 88.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 89.
