PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68450 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Vern Scovell of PO Box 151, Nehalem, Oregon, 97131, phone 368-5616, for the use of the waters of Zimmerman Creek, a tributary of Nehalem Bay,

for the PURPOSE of industrial uses in the Nehalem Bay water front industrial park

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from July 29, 1985

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 3.0 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1840 feet South and 40 feet West from the North quarter corner of Section 2, being within the SE 1/4 NW 1/4 Section 2, Township 2 North, Range 10 West, WM, in the County of Tillamook.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Actual construction work shall begin on or before July 17, 1987, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 88 .

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 89 .
