PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68735 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Gary G. Bliss, P.E. of 11080 SW Allen Blvd, Suite 100, Beaverton, Oregon, 97005, phone 643-9410, for the use of the waters of an unnamed stream tributary Willow Creek and two reservoirs to be constructed under Applica-* for the PURPOSE of maintenance of the two reservoirs for recreational uses including aesthetics, fish and fowl habitat

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from May 23, 1986

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.07 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: Lower dam: 2987 feet South and 20 feet East from the Southwest DLC corner of L.P. Day DLC #43; Upper dam: 2823 feet South and 485 feet East from the Southwest DLC corner of L.P. Day DLC #43, being within the SW 1/4 SW 1/4 Section 32, Township 1 North, Range 1 West, WM, in the County of Washington.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 1 North, Range 1 West, WM Section 32 SW 1/4 SW 1/4 Recreational uses including aesthetics, fish and fowl habitat

Provided further water shall not be appropriated from direct flow during the period from July 31 through September 15 of each year.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before July 17, 1987, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 88.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 89.
