PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68565 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Jane E. Solofra of PO Box 34, O'Brien, Oregon, 97534, phone 596-2392, for the use of the waters of West Fork of Illinois River, a tributary of Illinois River,
for the PURPOSE of domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre noncommercial garden

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from April 2, 1986

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 2424 feet North and 2050 feet East from the Southwest corner of Section 26, being within the NE 1/4 SW 1/4 Section 26, Township 40 South, Range 9 West, WM, in the County of Josephine.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 40 South, Range 9 West, WM Section 26 NE 1/4 SW 1/4 Domestic including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre noncommercial garden

Actual construction work shall begin on or before August 7, 1987, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 88.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 89.
