## PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68668 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Raymond H. Moor of 8749 South Myrtle, Myrtle Creek, Oregon, 97457, for the use of the waters of South Myrtle Creek, a tributary of South Umpqua River, for the PURPOSE of domestic for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden.

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from February 7, 1986

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 60 feet North and 1200 feet East from the quarter corner of Section 22 and 23, being within the SW 1/4 NW 1/4 Section 23, Township 29 South, Range 4 West, WM, in the County of Douglas.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 29 South, Range 4 West, WM Section 23 SW 1/4 NW 1/4 Domestic use including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

The use of water for irrigation during the period July 15 through September 30 of each year is limited to the irrigation of a noncommercial garden not to exceed one-half acre in area.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before August 7, 1987, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 88.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 89.
