PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68693 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Robert W. Waldo of 22105 East Beaver Creek Road, Cloverdale, Oregon, 97112, phone 398-5421, for the use of the waters of a spring, a tributary of East Beaver Creek, for the PURPOSE of domestic for two families including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from March 27, 1986

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 54 feet South and 877 feet West from the Northeast of the SW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 21, being within the SW 1/4 NW 1/4 Section 21, Township 3 South, Range 9 West, WM, in the County of Tillamook.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 3 South, Range 9 West, WM Section 21 NW 1/4 NW 1/4 Domestic for two families including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

Actual construction work shall begin on or before August 7, 1987, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 88.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 89.
