This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68731 This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68731 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

Carl Sheedy of PO Box 536, John Day, Oregon, 97845, This permit is issued to 575-1936, for the use of the waters of a small marshy spring, a tributary of Little Pine Drainage,

for the PURPOSE of domestic for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden,

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from May 22, 1986

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 45 feet South and 165 feet West from the Northeast corner of SE 1/4 of Section 6, being within the NE 1/4 SE 1/4 Section 6, Township 14 South, Range 32 East, WM, in the County of Grant.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 14 South, Range 32 East, WM Section 5 Lot 4

Domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and non-commercial garden

Actual construction work shall begin on or before AUGUST 28, 1987 , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 88 . Extended to October 1, 1989 Extended to October 1, 1999, 10-1-92.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 89 Extended to October 1, 1990 / 10-1-92
