PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68715 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to City of Westfir, PO Box 296, Westfir, Oregon, 97492, phone 782-3733, for the use of the waters of North Fork of the Willamette River, a tributary of Willamette River, for the PURPOSE of Municipal,

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from July 10, 1986,

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 1.0 cubic foot per second.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 457 feet North and 458 feet West from the East quarter corner of Section 7 and for EMERGENCY USE ONLY: 1200 feet North and 400 feet West of the East quarter corner of Section 7, both being within the SE 1/4 NE 1/4 Section 7, Township 21 South, Range 3 East, WM, in the County of Lane.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:
