PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68860 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Malcolm E. Wright, Jr. and Eileen M. Wright of PO Box 115, Westlake, Oregon, 97493, phone 997-8803, for the use of the waters of Sitcoos River, a tributary of Pacific Ocean,

for the PURPOSE of Domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one—half acre lawn and noncommercial garden,

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from September 11, 1986,

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 835 feet South and 1640 feet East from the Northwest corner of Section 34, being within the NE 1/4 NW 1/4 Section 34, Township 19 South, Range 12 West, WM, in the County of Lane.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 19 South, Range 12 West, WM Section 34 NE1/4 NW1/4

Domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

Actual construction work shall begin on or before October 21, 1987 , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 88 .

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 89 .
