PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68819 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Prairie Water Serving Corp., Box 282, Prairie City, Oregon, 97869, for the use of the waters of John Day River,

for the PURPOSE of irrigation of 1.2 acres,

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from

August 8, 1986,

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.03 cubic foot per second.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1990 feet North and 1050 feet West from the Southeast corner of Section 7, being within the NE 1/4 SE 1/4 Section 7, Township 13 South, Range 34 East, WM, in the County of Grant.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 13 South, Range 33 East, WM Section 11 NW1/4 SE1/4 1.2 acres

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/40 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 5.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before December 22, 1987, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 88

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 89.
