## PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68686 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Richard K. and Darlene N. McCulloch of 290 South Fork Little Butte Creek Road, Eagle Point, Oregon, 97524, phone 826-7237, for the use of the waters of Little Butte Creek, a tributary of Rogue River, for the PURPOSE of irrigation of 10.0 acres.

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from March 13, 1986 for 0.013 cfs and June 2, 1986 for 0.112 cfs,

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.125 cubic foot per second.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 560 feet South 57 degrees West from the Southeast corner of Section 13, being within the NE 1/4 NE 1/4 Section 24, Township 36 South, Range 1 East, WM, in the County of Jackson.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 36 South, Range 1 East, WM Section 13 SE1/4 SE1/4 4.0 acres Section 24 NE1/4 NE1/4 6.0 acres

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before January 30, 1988 , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 88 .

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 89 .
