PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68810 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Richard A. Springs, III and Deborah B. Springs of Route 2, Box 60-A, Adrian, Oregon, 97901, phone 339-3772, for the use of the waters of Sucker Creek, a tributary of Snake River, for the PURPOSE of Irrigation of 198.9 acres,

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from August 5, 1985 for 0.024 cubic foot per second and October 2, 1986 for 4.945 cubic feet per second

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 4.97 cubic feet per second.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 800 feet South and 600 feet West from the Northeast corner of SE 1/4 NE 1/4 Section 28, being within the SE 1/4 NE 1/4 Section 28, Township 23 South, Range 46 East, WM, in the County of Malheur.

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to $\frac{1}{40}$ of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before March 31, 1988, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 88.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 89.
