PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68827 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

Orville Woods and Elaine Woods of Route 1, Box 14, Richland, This permit is issued to Oregon, 97870, phone 893-6211, for the use of the waters of an unnamed spring area, a tributary of Powder River, for the PURPOSE of Domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed

one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden,

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from August 18, 1986,

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 foot per second.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1700 feet North and 400 feet West from the South quarter corner of Section 13, being within the NE 1/4 SW 1/4 Section 13, Township 9 South, Range 45 East, WM, in the County of Baker.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 9 South, Range 45 East, WM Section 13 SE1/4 SW1/4

Domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

Actual construction work shall begin on or before March 31, 1988 reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 $_{88}$. , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 89 .
