PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 68878 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

Vernice B. Gwilliam and George W. Gwilliam, of 1975 Myrtle This permit is issued to Street, Baker, Oregon, 97814, phone 523-3893, for the use of the waters of a spring, a tributary of Mill Creek, for the PURPOSE of Domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed

one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden,

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from September 22, 1986,

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 270 feet North and 350 feet East from the Southwest corner of SE 1/4 NE 1/4 Section 1, being within the SE 1/4 NE 1/4 Section 1, Township 9 South, Range 38 East, WM, in the County of Baker.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 9 South, Range 38 East, WM SE1/4 NE1/4 Section 1

Domestic for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed onehalf acre lawn and noncommercial garden

Actual construction work shall begin on or before April 23, 1988 , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 89 .

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 90 .
