PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 69022 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Robert James Lofgren of PO Box 5013, Oregon City, Oregon, 97045, phone 656-0596, for the use of the waters of an unnamed stream, a tributary of Beaver Creek, and Lofgren Reservoir to be constructed under Application R-69021, * for the PURPOSE of Domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden and recreation, being 0.01 cubic foot per second from the unnamed stream for domestic use and 0.01 cfs from the unnamed ** that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from February 27, 1987,

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.02 cubic foot per second.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 4600 feet North and 2400 feet West from the Southeast corner of Section 13, being within the NW 1/4 NE 1/4 Section 13, Township 3 South, Range 1 East, WM, in the County of Clackamas.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

- * Permit R-10825,
- ** stream for maintenance of the reservoir for recreation,

Township 3 South, Range 1 East, WM Section 13 NW1/4 NE1/4

Domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden and recreation

Actual construction work shall begin on or before June 23, 1988 reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 89.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 90 .
