PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION **69034** and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to **Fredrick G. and Nancy M. Sharp** of **3232 Galice Road, Merlin, Oregon, 97532**, phone **479-0637**, for the use of the waters of **Jumpoff Joe Creek**, a tributary of **Rogue River**, for the PURPOSE of **Domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre noncommercial garden**,

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from **March 23, 1987**,

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed **0.01 cubic foot per second**.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: **1400 feet North and 120 feet East from the Southwest corner of Section 13, being within the NW 1/4 SW 1/4 Section 13, Township 35 South, Range 7 West, WM, in the County of Josephine.**

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

<p>Township 35 South, Range 7 West, WM Section 13 SW1/4 SW1/4</p>	<p>Domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre non-commercial garden</p>
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Actual construction work shall begin on or before **June 30, 1988**, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before **October 1, 19 89**.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before **October 1, 19 90**.
