## PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 69078 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Timothy J. Porter of 1012 Curry Road, Roseburg, Oregon, 97470, phone 672-7420, for the use of the waters of North Umpqua River, a tributary of Umpqua River,

Umpqua River, for the PURPOSE of Domestic use for one family and irrigation of 8.0 acres, being 0.005 cubic foot per second for domestic and 0.1 cfs for irrigation,

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from May 4, 1987,

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.105 cubic foot per second.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 330 feet South and 590 feet West from the East quarter corner of Section 24, being within the NE 1/4 SE 1/4 Section 24, Township 26 South, Range 5 West, WM, in the County of Douglas.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 26 South, Range 5 West, WM Section 24 SE1/4 NE1/4 0.3 acre NE1/4 SE1/4 7.7 acres

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 90 , 10-1-9 J
