PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 69077 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Dallas V. and Merry J. Colvin of 34161 Spud Road, Agness, Oregon 97406, 247-2802, for the use of the waters of Tom Fry Creek, a tributary of Rogue River, for the PURPOSE of Domestic use including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden,

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from May 4, 1987,

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1020 feet South and 200 feet West from the quarter Section corner common to Section 13, Township 35 South, Range 12 West, and Section 18, Township 35 South, Range 11 West, being within the NE 1/4 SE 1/4, Section 13, Township 35 South, Range 12 West, WM, in the County of Curry.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 35 South, Range 12 West, WM Section 13 NE1/4 SE1/4	Domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and non-commercial garden
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Actual construction work shall begin on or before August 18, 1988, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 89 .

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 90 .
