### PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 67335 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to August T. Gehrig of 3381 Gilhouley Road, Hood River, Oregon 97031, phone (503)354-1011, for the use of the waters of two streams and an unnamed drainage way tributaries of Odell Creek, Reservoir 1, Reservoir 7, Reservoir 8 to \* for the PURPOSE of irrigation of 84.2 acres

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from March 13, 1987,

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 1.05 cubic feet per second, being 0.26 cubic foot per second from West unnamed stream, 0.77 cfs from East unnamed stream, and 0.02 cfs from unnamed drainageway with any \*\*

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: Reservoir 8 - 320 feet South and 1700 feet East, being within the NE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 28; Reservoir 1 - 420 feet South and 1420 feet East, being within the NE 1/4 SW 1/4 and NW 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 28; Reservoir 2 - 1050 feet South and 1220 feet East, being within the NW 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 28; Reservoir 7 - 2300 feet South and 270 feet East, being within the \*\*\*

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

\* be constructed under Application R-67951, Permit R-10835 and Reservoir 2, Reservoir 3, Reservoir 4, Reservoir 5, and Reservoir 6 to be constructed under Application R-67952, Permit R-10836

\*\* in the available supply from the unnamed drainageway to be made up by appropriation from East unnamed stream; all streams to be supplemented by use of stored water from the eight reservoirs, deficiency

\*\*\* SW 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 28, all from the West 1/4 Corner of Section 28; Reservoir 6 - 600 feet South and 1050 feet West within the NE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 33; Reservoir 5 - 850 feet South and 1250 feet West, NE 1/4 NW 1/4 within the Section 33; Reservoir 4 - 1050 feet South and 1350 feet West within the NW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 33; Reservoir 3 - 1380 feet South and 1400 feet West within the SW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 33, all from South 1/4 Corner; Unnamed stream West - 980 feet South and 1120 feet West from the Southwest Corner of Section 28, being within the NE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 32, all within Township 2 North, Range 10 East, WM, in the County of Hood River.

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4.0 acre-feet per acre from direct flow and storage from reservoirs to be constructed under Permits R-10835 and R-10836, and, shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before October 5, 1988 , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 89 .

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 90 .
