PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION ⁶⁷⁴³⁶ and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to

Donald C.J. McElligott, Morrow County Judge on behalf of County of Morrow, PO Box 788, Heppner, Oregon 97836, 676-9233, for the use of the waters of Willow Creek, a tributary of Columbia River, for the PURPOSE of maintenance of reservoir for recreation,

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from

October 10, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed

3.5 cubic feet

per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED:

1500 feet North and 3050 feet East from the Southwest Corner of Section 35, being within the NW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 35, Township 2 South, Range 26 East, WM, in the County of Morrow.
