PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES FOR ABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from

February 19, 1987,

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed

0.4 cubic foot

per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED:

2320 feet North and 2130 feet East rrom the Southwest Corner of Section 9, being within the NE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 9, Township 30 South, Range 4 West, WM, in the County of Douglas.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, being further limited during the period July 15 through September 30 of each year to the irrigation of a noncommercial garden not to exceed one-half acre in area and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{2}$
