PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION **69188** and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Mayron H. Schutte of 1537 West Catching Slough Road, Coos Bay, Oregon 97420, phone 267-7360, for the use of the waters of an unnamed stream, tributary of Catching Slough,

for the PURPOSE of

Irrigation of 1.5 acres

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from

July 9, 1987

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed **1.0 1.0**

0.019 cubic

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 890 feet South and 770 feet West from the Northeast corner of Section 7, being within the NE1/4 NE1/4 of Section 7, Township 26 South, Range 12 West, W.M., in the County of Coos.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 26 South, Range 12 West, W.M., Section 7 NE1/4 NE1/4 1.5 acres

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before October 30, 1988, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 89.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 90.
