PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 69218 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Alfred and Colleen Nylen of 2324 Dakhill Drive, Roseburg, Oregon 97470, phone 672-3744, for the use of the waters of the North Umpqua River.

for the PURPOSE of Domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one—half acre of lawn or noncommercial garden,

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from August 3, 1987,

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1760 feet South and 110 feet East from the Northwest corner of Section 17, being within the SW1/4 NW1/4 of Section 17, Township 26 South, Range 4 West, W.M., in the County of Douglas.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 26 South, Range 4 West, W.M., Section 17 SW1/4 NW1/4 Domestic use for

Domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one—half acre lawn or noncommercial garden.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before November 24, 1988, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 90.
