PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION **69234** and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to **Edna M. Barker and Loene C. Bronson** of **3605 Circle Drive, Albany, Oregon 97321, phone 926-6697**, for the use of the waters of a spring (Fiddler Spring), a tributary of the Willamette River, for the PURPOSE of **Domestic use for two families including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre of lawn or noncommercial garden for westerly family,**

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from **August 13, 1987,**

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed **0.01 cubic foot per second.**

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: **South 30 degrees West a distance of 338 feet from the North Quarter Corner of Section 13, being within the NE1/4 NW1/4 of Section 13, Township 8 South, Range 4 West, W.M., in the County of Marion.**

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 8 South, Range 4 West, W.M., Section 13 NE1/ NW1/4 Domestic use for two families including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn or noncommercial garden for the westerly family.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before **December 9, 1988**, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before **October 1, 19 89.**

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before **October 1, 19 90.**
