PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 69236 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Dean C. and Ione E. Rammage of 9048 South Bank Road, Roseburg, Oregon 97470, phone 672-7454, for the use of the waters of the North Umpqua River,

for the PURPOSE of Domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre of lawn or noncommercial garden,

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from August 17, 1987,

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 320 feet North and 175 feet East from the West Quarter Corner of Section 19 being within the SW1/4 NW1/4 of Section 19, Township 26 South, Range 4 West, W.M., in the County of Douglas.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 26 South, Range 4 West, W.M., Section 19 SW1/4 NW1/4 Domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn or noncommercial garden.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before December 9, 1988, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 89.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 90.
