PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 69332 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Jon Harrison of 137 Echo Drive, Roseburg, Oregon 97470, phone 673-8882, for the use of the waters of the North Umpqua River, a tributary of the Umpqua River, for the PURPOSE of irrigation of 5.0 acres,

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from September 29, 1987,

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.063 cubic foot per second.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 370 feet North and 580 feet West from the Center Quarter corner of Section 14, being within the SE1/4 NW1/4 of Section 14, Township 26 South, Range 5 West, W.M., in the County of Douglas.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 26 South, Range 5 West, W.M., Section 14	SW1/4 NE1/4	2.1 acres
	SE1/4 NW1/4	2.9

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to $\frac{1}{80}$ of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before January 21, 1989, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 89.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 90.
