PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 69316 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Leopold Lewandowski of Rt. 1, Box 630, Bandon, Oregon 97411, phone 347-9934, for the use of the waters of an unnamed tributary of Johnson Creek,

for the PURPOSE of maintenance of an unnamed reservoir to be constructed under Application R-69315, Permit R-10890, for aesthetics,

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from September 23, 1987,

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 50 feet South and 175 feet East from the Center Quarter corner of Section 1, being within the NW1/4 SE1/4 of Section 1, Township 29 South, Range 15 West, W.M., in the County of Coos.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 29 South, Range 15 West, W.M., Section 1 NW1/4 SE1/4	Maintenance of a reservoir for aesthetics

Actual construction work shall begin on or before January 29, 1989, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 89.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 90.
