### PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

PORTLAND GENERAL ELECTRIC COMPANY

is hereby issued a permit to use waters from the DESCHUTES RIVER, A TRIBUTARY OF COLUMBIA RIVER for DOMESTIC supplies for 21 families AND IRRIGATION OF LAWNS AND NON-COMMERCIAL GARDENS not to exceed 1/2 acre in area for each of 30 families.

This permit to the use of these waters has been issued under Application 69435 with a date of priority of OCTOBER 29, 1987.

This permit is limited to not more than 0.41 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, BEING 0.03 CFS DOMESTIC SUPPLIES & 0.38 CFS FOR IRRIGATION OF LAWNS & GARDENS or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

SE 1/4 SW 1/4, Section 1, T 10 S, R 12 E, WM;  
830 FEET NORTH & 115 FEET WEST FROM S1/4 CORNER, SECTION 1

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use of water allowed under this permit shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the permit is as follows:

	1/4 1/4	SECTION	TOWNSHIP	RANGE, WM
DOMESTIC	NW	SE	1	10 S 12 E
DOMESTIC	SW	SE	1	10 S 12 E

Actual construction work shall begin on or before July 12, 1989 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1990. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1991.
