PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

is hereby issued a permit to use the waters from CLARKS CREEK, a tributary of WILLOW CREEK for the IRRIGATION OF 27.64 ACRES subject to existing rights and minimum streamflows established by the Water Resources Commission with an effective date prior to this permit. This permit is issued under Application 69580 with a date of priority of APRIL 4, 1988.

This permit is limited to the amount of water that may be beneficially used not to exceed more than 0.4 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

NW 1/4 SE 1/4, Section 4, T 2 S, R 25 E, WM;
720 FEET SOUTH & 600 FEET EAST FROM CENTER 1/4 CORNER,
SECTION 4.

A description of the place of use under this permit is as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-SIXTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year,

The use of water allowed under this permit shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before July 18, 1989, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1990. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1991.
