### PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

is hereby issued a permit to use the waters from UNNAMED TRIBUTARIES OF NORTH FORK MALHEUR RIVER AT DRIBBLE SPRING, HORSESHOE SPRING, TUB SPRING AND 7-UP SPRING SITES for LIVESTOCK. The permit to the use of these waters has been issued under Application 67469 with a date of priority of OCTOBER 11, 1983. The permit is limited to not more than 0.01 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, FROM EACH SOURCE, PROVIDED THE TOTAL QUANTITY DIVERTED SHALL NOT EXCEED 0.015 CFS or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

point (1) LOT 4, (SW1/4 SW 1/4), Section 18, T 15 S, R 36 E, WM;  
1100 FEET NORTH & 1100 FEET EAST FROM SW CORNER, SECTION 18.

point (2) SE 1/4 SW 1/4, Section 36, T 15 S, R 35 E, WM;  
1000 FEET NORTH & 1500 FEET EAST FROM SW CORNER, SECTION 36.

point (3) LOT 7, Section 1, T 16 S, R 35 E, WM;  
300 FEET SOUTH & 1300 FEET EAST FROM SW CORNER, SECTION 31.

point (4) LOT 5, Section 1, T 16 S, R 35 E, WM;  
2300 FEET SOUTH & 1500 FEET EAST FROM NW CORNER, SECTION 1.

The use of water allowed under this permit shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.
