is hereby issued a permit to use the waters from UNNAMED TRIBUTARIES OF THE LITTLE MALHEUR RIVER AT THE BULLRUN SPRING, RIMROCK SPRING, O'BRIAN SPRING, TAMARACK SPRING AND HUNTER SPRING SITES for LIVESTOCK. The permit to the use of these waters has been issued under Application 67471 with a date of priority of OCTOBER 11, 1983. The permit is limited to not more than 0.01 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND FROM EACH SOURCE, PROVIDED THE TOTAL QUANTITY DIVERTED FROM ALL SOURCES SHALL NOT EXCEED 0.015 CFS or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

point (1) SW 1/4 SW 1/4, Section 27, T 14 S, R 36 E, WM;
900 FEET NORTH & 600 FEET EAST FROM SW CORNER, SECTION 27.

point (2) NW 1/4 NE 1/4, Section 25, T 15 S, R 36 E, WM;
700 FEET SOUTH & 2400 FEET WEST FROM NE CORNER, SECTION 25.

point (3) NW 1/4 SW 1/4, Section 24, T 15 S, R 36 E, WM;
2630 FEET NORTH & 600 FEET EAST FROM SW CORNER, SECTION 24.

point (4) NW 1/4 SW 1/4, Section 19, T 15 S, R 36 E, WM;
2500 FEET NORTH & 900 FEET EAST FROM SW CORNER, SECTION 19.

point (5) SW 1/4 NE 1/4, Section 30, T 15 S, R 36 E, WM;
2000 FEET SOUTH & 1900 FEET WEST FROM NE CORNER, SECTION 30.

The use of water allowed under this permit shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The place of use is as follows:

point 2 LIVESTOCK	NW NE	25	14 S	36 E

Actual construction work shall begin on or before October 10, 1989, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1990. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1991.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water. By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan. It is possible that the land use you propose may not be allowed if it is not in keeping with the goals and the acknowledged plan. Your city or county planning agency can advise you about the land-use plan in your area.

The right is subject to minimum flows established by the Water Resources Commission with an effective date prior to this right.
