is hereby issued a permit to use the waters from SEWAGE TREATMENT PLANT EFFLUENT for SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 48.7 ACRES. The permit to the use of these waters has been issued under Application 69209 with a date of priority of JULY 27, 1987. The permit is limited to not more than 0.61 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The plant discharge is located as follows:

SW 1/4 NW 1/4, Section 17, T 22 S, R 5 W, WM;  
1430 FEET SOUTH & 650 FEET EAST FROM NW CORNER, SECTION 17.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. The permit shall be limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior permit for the same land and shall not exceed the limitation allowed herein.

The use of water allowed under this permit shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The place of use is as follows:

Actual construction work shall begin on or before October 10, 1989, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1990. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1991.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water. By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan. It is possible that the land use you propose may not be allowed if it is not in keeping with the goals and the acknowledged plan.
