is hereby issued a permit to use the waters from SNAKE RIVER, A  
TRIBUTARY OF COLUMBIA RIVER for IRRIGATION OF 29.22 ACRES. The  
permit to the use of these waters has been issued under Application 69291  
with a date of priority of MARCH 9, 1988. The permit is limited to not more  
than 0.73 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation,  
measured at the point of diversion.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

NE 1/4 NW 1/4, Section 28, T 19 S, R 47 E, WM;  
318 FEET SOUTH & 2325 FEET EAST FROM NW CORNER, SECTION 28.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured  
under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-  
FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each  
acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4.0  
acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each  
year.

The use of water allowed under this permit shall conform to such reasonable  
rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The place of use is as follows:

Actual construction work shall begin on or before October 10, 1989, and shall  
be completed on or before October 1, 1990. Complete application of the water  
to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1991.
